ONLINE SECURE ACCESS: RoadID.com

In a secure online application, you can enter your:

- **Emergency contacts** and their info
- **Names of your meds** & their dosages
- **Names of your doctors** & contact info
- **Medical history**
- **Notes** on any of the above

You can ALSO upload documentation you would like to have access to. **NOT limited to medical.**

- You can upload it all in the same place
 - **Escape/Survival plans & strategies**
 - **Coping tools**
 - **Meeting points** with safe people
 - **Other info** you might need to know or have access to after escape



HOW TO USE THE ID

Depending on your level of safety, there are many options to use this tool:

- **WEAR** it on a smart watch band for emergencies (*my personal choice for health issues*)
- **HIDE** it with a **safe person** in case you need access to it in an emergency
- **ATTACH** it to a bag or shoelaces
- **PACK** it in your **EMERGENCY GO BAG**

CONTROL OVER LOSS OF ACCESS

Tool is a powerful help if you are in danger of losing access to your medical info from:

- Domestic violence
- ICE
- Any other trauma that would restrict your access to your information

AFTER YOU ENTER YOUR INFO ONLINE

- There is a small annual fee*
- You will be given a code to put with your stuff or to wear (**ONLY if that is safe for you**)
- You can get it engraved on a smart watch ID or on a tag for shoelaces or for a bracelet
- There does **NOT** have to be identifying information on the tag —just a code
- You can also add a couple lines of notes—especially useful if you're using it for disabilities, as emergency workers are trained to look for these tags

SAFETY NOTES

- The site with your info is *password protected* to EDIT anything
- The CODE printed gives access to anyone to look it up *if they have the number and the website*
 - **Keep the code safe**, know it is useless without knowing *which site to enter it to*, so if you remember RoadID.com and only have the code, it is safe from prying eyes
 - The code is located on the inside of the engraved item (*mine is on a clasp on my smart watch band, but the code is hidden and can only be seen by taking my watch off*)
